

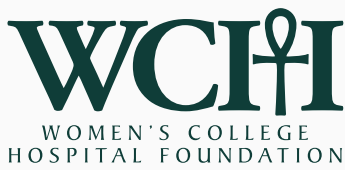

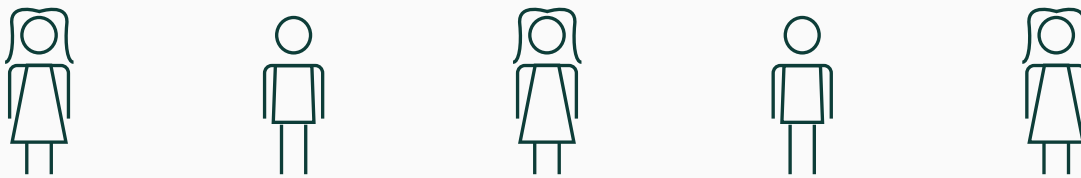

CREATING A MORE DIVERSE AND INCLUSIVE BEVERAGE ALCOHOL INDUSTRY with Black Opportunity Fund



At LCBO, we recognize Black History Month in February as a time to celebrate the significant contributions Black Ontarians have made to our province – and we remain committed year-round to empowering future generations.

As part of our efforts, LCBO is pleased to partner with Black Opportunity Fund to provide grants to Black entrepreneurs and their businesses within the beverage alcohol industry. Through the **Black Beverage Alcohol Business Grant**, our partnership will provide non-repayable grants of **\$20K to up to five Black entrepreneurs** who are already operating small businesses in the beverage alcohol industry, helping them grow their ventures.

2025 marks five years since we launched the Spirit of Inclusion Initiative, reflecting our commitment to enhancing industry diversity, as part of our Spirit of Sustainability platform. The initiative is designed to create opportunities for diverse women to enter, advance, and thrive within the beverage alcohol industry.

Together with our education and beverage alcohol partners, the initiative provides bursaries

and scholarships, access to mentorship, and identifies paid co-op placements for diverse women looking to enter this industry.

To commemorate this milestone – as part of our Women’s History Month celebrations in March – we interviewed four scholarship recipients and asked them what this initiative means to them:

“With the mentorship program, I was able to meet with industry experts from sales and marketing, as well as production. It really allowed me to see the whole picture.”
